Introduction

The workshop will provide venue for participants from China, Cambodia, Laos PDR, Thailand and Vietnam to share knowledge and information about education and training of upland agriculture that would transect portions of the three countries within GMS to enable better understanding of regional land use dynamics and trans-boundary issues, emerging issues of common concern include: 1) Upland and lowland duality, 2) High rate of upland area conversion, 3) Food production for upland population, 4) Maintaining cultural, biological, and environmental diversity, and 5) Poverty alleviation and alternative livelihoods for upland communities.

Specifically, we seek to augment active education and research efforts as mentioned above in the areas of poverty reduction, environmentally conscious food production systems for sustainable livelihood life-style, and decision support tools for environmental impact assessment currently underway at the key institutions in GMS.

Objectives

The main objectives of the workshop are to:

- 1. Gain better understand and to compile current upland agriculture curriculum in participating countries.
- 2. Build network of educators and researchers to conduct interdisciplinary and collaborative research related to upland agriculture.
- 3. Provide a forum to facilitate dialogue and recommendations.

Expected outcomes

Through the workshop interactions, diverse contributions from the participants, multiple outcomes are expected to emerge from the workshop, including:

- 1. Proceedings of the workshop.
- 2. Draft short-term training programs focusing on issues of upland agriculture.
- 3. Draft proposals for collaborative research for follow-up actions to cover issues like;
 - o Watershed management and sustainable resource management techniques,
 - o Community-based resource management
 - o Sustainable food production systems
 - Decision Support tools and Information and extension service systems for upland communities
